Progress

- Met with over 60 legislators during the 2022 session; roughly half of our meetings were with Democrats, half with Republicans.
- Engaged 5 churches to partner with a State Legislator to explore incorporating lowincome housing into their church campuses to help with the housing / homelessness crisis in Arizona.
- Connected with key Arizona pastors on the topic of foster care, to recommunicate to their congregations the need for new foster parents as well as surrounding support for foster parents.
